The SAM Initiative Completes Annual Giving Cycle with Milestone \$320,000 in Grants to Four Local Nonprofits

Giving Circle Tops \$3.3 Million in Grants Since 2014

The SAM Initiative recently completed its annual giving cycle, donating a total of \$320,000 to four grantees. Now in its 11th year, SAM is a giving circle, started by Los Angeles philanthropist and nonprofit strategist Mindy Freedman. SAM's mission is to passionately pool charitable dollars to fund and support programs committed to driving social change and promoting nonprofit sustainability.

SAM is fueled by Freedman's personal motto: "We can do far more together than we can alone." Since its first giving cycle in 2014, SAM has granted more than \$3.3 million to local nonprofits.

The primary focus for this most recent cycle was supporting local nonprofit organizations that work in mental health and food security. In a milestone achievement, SAM was able to fund each of the four grantees at \$80,000 each:

<u>Alzheimer's LA</u>: Improving the lives of families affected by Alzheimer's and dementia by increasing awareness, delivering effective programs and services, providing compassionate support, and advocating for quality care and a cure.

<u>LA Food Policy</u> - With a mission to create a local food system free from hunger, LA Food Policy is rooted in equity and access, supportive of farmers and food workers, and guided by principles of environmental stewardship and regeneration.

<u>Open Paths Counseling Center</u> - Addressing the evolving mental health needs of the community through quality counseling for individuals and families at affordable fees Open Paths offers free therapy programs for at-risk children and youth in local schools; and a highly-respected therapist training program.

<u>Teen Talk App</u> - A mobile app that provides a free, anonymous, safe space for teens to request support from trained peers and learn from others with similar experiences.

SAM is appreciative and thanks the Jewish Community Foundation (JCF) for providing their expertise and advisory support to enhance SAM's process.
